Expectations of the school



- Our Mission Statement reflects our wish to educate all children using Gospel values as our guide. Values such as tolerance, compassion, understanding and forgiveness.
- The St Mary's Way shows the key foci for the school from the point of view of the pupils.
- We expect all communications between us to be respectful and in keeping with our school ethos even when there are difficult conversations to be had.
- All adults at home and in school are positive role models for the children and so we expect all conduct to be in keeping with this.
- Keeping children safe is a top priority for us e.g. Arrangements for bringing and collecting children. Should you not be able to collect your child after school yourself, we operate a password system. You will need to ensure that you give the password you choose (and that you have told the school) to the adult collecting your child. No password then no child will be handed over.
- Correct school uniform is expected to be worn at all times. Hairstyles must be in keeping with the school uniform policy. Earrings must be removed by the child before PE. Please note that staff are not allowed to remove them for the child.

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Skills to being a great learner



As well as all of the academic skills that we learn in Reception class we also learn some key skills to being a great learner:

- being willing to have a go and try something new
- bouncing back after difficulties and persisting in the face of challenge
- being encouraged and supported to have their own ideas finding more than one way of doing something
- being proud of how they achieve something, not just the achievement itself
- making links and connections between their learning

What can you do to help?



Talk with your child – a child who is spoken to regularly develops language more quickly which leads them to being super readers and writers.

Count with your child – incidental counting as you are climbing the stairs, setting the table, choosing the shopping etc leads to children who are most confident with number leading to great mathematicians.

Read them stories – children who are read to develop stronger language skills which enables them to have super imaginations.

Encourage them to share and negotiate – children who can share well find making friends easier which leads to a happier time at school!

What Parents/Carers can do to prepare for starting school.

Teach your child to be;

- Independent in eating with a knife and fork,
- Able to dress themselves without an adult doing it for them,
- Able to get ready to go to school having all the things they will need,
- Able to go to the toilet and wash their hands
- Able to blow their nose and put the tissue in the bin.
- In school each day as a day out of school is a day's education missed
- On time for school each day as punctuality is very important for life.
- Able to develop their fine motor skills e.g. By holding a pencil, knife and fork
- Able to recognise their letters leading to reading, recognise numbers, make marks leading to writing
- Recognise their names.
- Able to tidy up their toys, share with others
