We will be learning to:

- Settle into the school routine.

In our lessons we will be:

- Beginning phase 2 phonics.

Mathematics: Number and Numerical

Patterns:

The children will be learning to:

- Sort objects into groups.
- Compare amounts.
- Compare size, mass and capacity.
- Explore pattern.
- Explore and manipulate numbers 1-5.
- Compare shapes.

Understanding the World:

The children will be given the opportunity to:

- Explore the environment in autumn
- Talk about themselves, their families and their homes.
- Talk about their bodies, what did we used to be like in the past? How have we changed?
- Discuss the different jobs and opportunities people from their families/communities have compared to other cultures.

Expressive Arts and Design:

The children will be given the opportunity to:

- Draw, paint, print and experiment with 3D construction.
- Sing nursery rhymes - explore beat.
- Recognise fast/slow; loud/quiet.
- Talk about preferences; likes/dislikes.
- Junk modelling, mixing media, colour mixing.
- Play imaginatively

Physical Development:

We will be:
