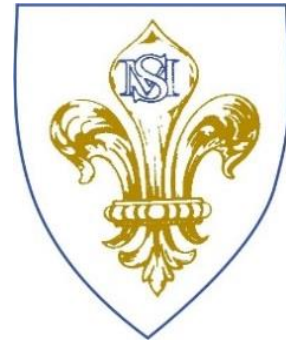

Religious Education

The RE topics for Spring are Galilee to Jerusalem and Desert to Garden

Within Religious Education we will be learning about:

- The wise men visiting baby Jesus
- Jesus blessing little children
- Special prayers
- Lent
- Preparing for Easter

Personal, Social and Emotional Development:

This term we will be learning about:

- Who the special people are in our lives
- What makes a good friend?
- How to stay safe on the internet

Physical Development:

We will be:

- Developing our pencil grip
- Throwing and catching
- Developing movement: balancing
- Dancing with a partner
- Putting on our coats and doing our zips up
- Developing our arm and finger strength with fine motor skills activities

Communication and Language

This term in Nursery we will be:

- Engaging in extended conversations about stories
- Following two-part instructions
- Spotting rhymes in our stories
- Exploring environmental sounds
- Working on questioning using what, where and who

Literacy:

This term in Nursery we will be:

- Sequencing stories
- Learning new vocabulary.
- Continuing to learn to write our names
- Clapping syllables in our names and other words
- Talking about stories, including predicting how they may end
- Exploring parts of the book
- Giving meaning to what we are writing

Mathematics: Number/Numerical Patterns:

The children will be learning to:

- Count objects, actions and sounds using one to one correspondence
- Recognise and start to write numerals
- Compare two groups of numbers using the vocabulary of more than/fewer than
- Experiment with symbols and mark making
- Identify and name common 2D shapes
- Respond to spatial and positional language
- Identify and continue simple ABAB patterns.

Understanding the World:

The children will be:

- Learning about the solar system and the planets
- Performing scientific experiments
- Learning about life cycles
- Sowing seeds and talking about new life
- Learning about nutrition and vegetables
- Growing vegetables

Expressive Arts and Design:

The children will be working on:

- Improving their cutting skills
- Experimenting with paint to discover new colours
- Creating their own art, using different materials and exploring different textures.
- Singing a variety of familiar songs
- Playing an instrument with increasing control
- Showing emotions in their drawing.
